

Why is God allowing our country to be run by socialists?

Why is God allowing our country to be run by socialists who seek to remove our freedoms, which will eventually lead to the persecution of Christians and Jews? God is the One who puts people in power. “And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings” (Dan. 2:21a). “...to the intent that the living may know that the most High ruleth in the kingdom of men, and giveth it to whomsoever he will, and setteth up over it the basest of men” (Dan. 4:17b). The truth is, God is allowing this to happen because of our sins – personally and nationally.

Today we see our nation having legalized and are promoting the breaking of God’s laws – with abortion – the murder of babies sacrificed for their mother’s lifestyles; all types of sexual sins including homosexuality (1 Cor. 6:9-10), transgenderism (Deu. 22:5), and pornography (Mat. 5:27-28); as well as pagan religions and paganized Christianity with its idolatry and pagan holidays instead of God’s Sabbaths. When a nation sins, as ours has, God promises punishment. “But it shall come to pass, if thou wilt not hearken unto the voice of Yehovah thy God, to observe to do all his commandments and his statutes which I command thee this day; that all these curses shall come upon thee, and overtake thee” (Deu. 28:15).

Let us look at the examples of ancient Israel:

- “And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of Yehovah, and forgat Yehovah their God, and served Baalim and the groves. Therefore the anger of Yehovah was hot against Israel, and He sold them into the hand of Chushan–rishathaim king of Mesopotamia: and the children of Israel served Chushan–rishathaim eight years” (Jud. 3:7-8).
- “And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of Yehovah: and Yehovah strengthened Eglon the king of Moab against Israel, because they had done evil in the sight of Yehovah ... So the children of Israel served Eglon the king of Moab eighteen years” (Jud. 3:12, 14).
- “And the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of Yehovah, when Ehud was dead. And Yehovah sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, that reigned in Hazor; the captain of whose host was Sisera, which dwelt in Harosheth of the Gentiles” (Jud. 4:1-2).
- “And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of Yehovah: and Yehovah delivered them into the hand of Midian seven years” (Jud. 6:1).
- “And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of Yehovah, and served Baalim, and Ashtoreth (Easter), and the gods of Syria, and the gods of Zidon, and the gods of Moab, and the gods of the children of Ammon, and the gods of the Philistines, and forsook Yehovah, and served not Him. And the anger of Yehovah was hot against Israel, and He sold them into the hands of the Philistines, and into the hands of the children of Ammon” (Jud. 10:6-7).
- “And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of Yehovah; and Yehovah delivered them into the hand of the Philistines forty years” (Jud. 13:1).
- “And they rejected His statutes, and His covenant that He made with their fathers, and His testimonies which He testified against them; and they followed vanity, and became vain, and went after the heathen that were round about them, concerning whom Yehovah had charged them, that they should not do like them. And they left all the commandments of Yehovah their God,... Until Yehovah removed Israel out of His sight, as He had said by all His servants the prophets. So was Israel carried away out of their own land to Assyria unto this day” (2 Kin. 17:15, 16a, 23).
- “They said, Turn ye again now every one from his evil way, and from the evil of your doings, and dwell in the land that Yehovah hath given unto you and to your fathers for ever and ever...

Behold, I will send and take all the families of the north, saith Yehovah, and Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon, my servant, and will bring them against this land, and against the inhabitants thereof, and against all these nations round about, and will utterly destroy them, and make them an astonishment, and an hissing, and perpetual desolations” (Jer. 25:5, 9).

Whenever the nation turned from God’s commandments, He put tyrants over them and took away their freedom until they repented.

God has sent our nation hurricanes, droughts, fires, and a pestilence (Covid-19, originating from eating unclean meat) to urge us to repent. Our people did not want to even acknowledge these events as a warning from God. So now, God has put the people in power who will seek to take our freedoms. The prophesied destruction and slavery coming to our people is certain without repentance. “At what instant I shall speak concerning a nation, and concerning a kingdom, to pluck up, and to pull down, and to destroy it; If that nation, against whom I have pronounced, turn from their evil, I will repent of the evil that I thought to do unto them” (Jer. 18:7-8).

What should we do? REPENT, repent of our sins individually and as a nation. If the nation does not repent, let God mark us as one of those who do not ignore the sins of our nation but as one who sighs and cries over them. “And Yehovah said unto him, Go through the midst of the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and set a mark upon the foreheads of the men that sigh and that cry for all the abominations that be done in the midst thereof” (Eze. 9:4). Our hope is in being saved in this modern Sodom as Lot was and as Noah was from the flood. “Because thou hast kept the word of my patience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth” (Rev. 3:10). “Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man” (Luk. 21:36). “Seek ye Yehovah, all ye meek of the earth, which have wrought his judgment; seek righteousness, seek meekness: it may be ye shall be hid in the day of Yehovah's anger” (Zep. 2:3).

Let us always put our faith in Yeshua and never in a man, a prince, a politician. “Put not your trust in princes, nor in the son of man, in whom there is no help” (Psa. 146:3). “It is better to trust in Yehovah than to put confidence in princes” (Psa. 118:9).

Instead of backing a political party, we should be backing the Gospel of the Kingdom of God, which includes repentance of breaking God’s laws – the ONLY hope for our nation.
